Process Statement: Space Questions Book

As part of our unit on space, 2-Purple made a list of our questions about space.

Then we decided we were interested to know what kids in other classes wanted to learn about space.

We wrote a letter to the other classes, and asked them to make us a list of questions that they had about space.

When we got lists of questions back from the questions, we read them and talked about them as a class.

As a reading center during our guided reading time, small groups of students rotated through a space box question center. Students in this center used books and computer research to find out the answers to these questions. When they answered a question, they checked it off the list, and put a sheet with the question and answer in the space box.

When all of the questions were answered, Ms. Robinson worked with a small group of volunteers to type up the book. Then student volunteers took home copies of the book to color illustrations that match the questions and answers that we had written.

Finally, we are passing copies of our book around the school to share with the rest of the children, so that they can see the answers to their questions.
